NORMAL COMMUNITY HIGH SCHOOL RECOGNITION FOR ACADEMIC DISTINCTION

Normal Community High School was recognized by the Illinois ACT State Organization and The ACT Midwest Region as one of only a few high schools in the state of Illinois to have had one or more students, as part of the graduating class of 2006, achieve a perfect score of 36 on the ACT. The recognition occurred during the luncheon at the ACT annual state conference held in Springfield on Tuesday, December 5, 2006.

Thirty-three students received a score of 36 on the ACT during the 2005-2006 school year. Normal Community was the only school to receive recognition on Tuesday. The remaining schools are located in the Chicago metropolitan area and the northern part of the state and received their awards on Wednesday, December 6, 2006.

Mrs. Danita Johnson, NCHS counselor, represented Dr. Nuckolls at the conference and accepted a plaque presented by Mr. Galen Johnson, Assistant Vice President, ACT Midwest Region. As he presented the award, Mr. Johnson stated that the student's score is a reflection of the school's commitment to teaching the core subjects, and a reflection of the hard work put forth by school's teachers and students. Congratulations were extended to the faculty, students and parents for the significant accomplishment.
