Two Simple Steps for an Opportunity of a Lifetime!!

1. Visit http://www.goarmy.com/rotc/hs_four_year_scholarship.jsp
2. Click "Take the next step: Create an account" link toward the bottom of the page.

High School Scholarships are available to high school juniors and seniors. The entire process is managed through www.goarmy.com. Applications open in **June between junior and senior year** and close in January of senior year. **Scholar/Athlete/Leader (SAL)** is the criteria used to select scholarship winners along with a desire to earn a commission.

Once the requirements are met the packet will go in front of a board and applicants will be assessed against their peers. There are three boards with the first one meeting in October. It is highly recommended to have your packet ready for the October board so in the event you are not selected your packet will move on to the next two boards if required to go that far.

All High School Scholarships require students to sign a contract with the Army. High school students can be awarded either a 3 year or 4 year scholarship to their school of choice. Scholarships cover either 100% tuition/fees **OR** room/board, \$1200/year for book allowance, and a monthly stipend for every month you are in school (about 10 months). Stipend amounts are dependent upon Military Science class and range from \$300-\$500 month.

Illinois State University is the host school for the Redbird Battalion. The Redbird Battalion commissioned its first Officers in 1981 and ever since we have been producing great leaders for the United States Army. Our Alumni are spread throughout the world serving in both the Active and Reserve components.

Today the Redbird Battalion trains Cadets from Illinois State University, Illinois Wesleyan University, and Bradley University.
