Director's Notes

This is an interesting script in that everyone usually finds their own opinion in it. Some will look at the strong Christian symbolism throughout and say, "There; this is a story about how every town needs a church." Some will watch Showers' struggle to find his own definition of faith and say, "Clearly, this is a play about how tragic it is when people push others toward their own beliefs."

My own take is a lot less definite. I watch the play unfold and see all these characters, everyone one of them generous and well-meaning people, fight to find the balance between faith, community, freedom, responsibility, a larger purpose, and love. The tragedy arises from each person's fear that someone else will define them; Showers fears that the women will turn him back into a preacher; Ferris dreads that Showers will make him confront his worst memory; even Buddy operates from a terror of someone putting him in water.

I like Basil's outlook. He finds solace in the feel of the earth and the look of the morning sun. He knows that no matter what our individual beliefs may be, we are always best when we form a community and support each other. "We turn to each other, and we call it a blessin'." My community has always been in the theatre, where diverse people can work together, sometimes agreeing on very little except that good art is a larger purpose, and doing it together makes us better.

Whether you find your divinity in stained glass or the hills at sunrise, we hope you enjoy our show, and thank you for the opportunity to perform it. I thank you.


