Reading Time

Families often ask our teachers what they can do to help their child become a better reader. One of the best things you can do is to make sure there is a designated reading time each and every night of the week. For the younger students, taking time to read to them helps create an early love for reading. As they begin to develop their skills you can alternate reading pages of a book with them. Even as kids get a little older in their elementary school years, kids still enjoy sitting and listening to a book being read to them, even if it's a few pages a night from a longer novel. Once kids become proficient readers, having a window of time where everyone sits and reads quietly together as a family in the same room can be a very powerful thing.
