9th Grade Medical Requirements:

- All 9th grade students are required by Illinois law to turn in a school physical and complete immunization record by the first day of school. The physical must be on the State of Illinois Examination form and must be dated within one calendar year prior to the date of entry. This needs to be turned in to the school nurse.
- Please turn a second copy of the physical into athletics if your child will be participating in sports. This may be emailed to wagnerba@unit5.org. A physical on the IHSA sports form is not acceptable as a school physical.
- A state law indicates all 9th grade students will be required to provide proof of a dental exam. The exam is due May 15th, 2025. Any exam on or after December 1, 2023 will fulfill this requirement.

You may submit your child's physical, immunization record, and dental form in any of the following ways prior to registration in the fall:

FAQs for NCHS:

Where do I find a school supply list?

There are no school supply lists for high school students. Students should bring paper and pen/pencil with them to the first day of school when each teacher will tell them what they need for their specific classes.

What if I need to call my student out of school during the school day?

If a parent calls in their student late or for early dismissal, they do not have to come in to sign their student out. Your student will have a pass issued once the call is received. Your student will sign in and out of the Greeter's Station as you walk into the building. The NCHS Attendance line is (309) 557-4450.

If your student is out for two or more days due to illness, you may request homework by emailing your child's teachers. In some instances, you may need to come and pick up material at school, whereas in other instances some of the material your child missed might be available online through Google Classroom.

If your student needs to be absent all day, part of the day or needs to be released at a certain time, please call our attendance hotline to report the absence or early release. The attendance hotline is (309) 557-4450.

• For early dismissal, allow at least two hours notice in the early morning hours. One hour notice is appreciated for all other absences. If you do not call ahead, you may have to wait up to 30 minutes while we send for your student.

Is there a nurse at NCHS?

Yes. If your child isn't feeling well, they need to get a pass from a teacher, if possible, and proceed to the nurse. The nurse can contact the student's family if the student needs to go home. If your student contacts you directly without going through the nurse, then you will need to call the attendance line to get your student out, as the school will not know they are going home otherwise.

How does the cafeteria work?

Your student will need to use their student ID card to get lunch from the cafeteria lines. This differs from the middle school where your child used a PIN number to purchase their lunch. If your child would like to bring their own lunch from home, that is also allowed. Please note that having outside food delivered (example – UberEats, DoorDash, etc) is NOT allowed.



What does my child need for PE?

Your child will need a gray t-shirt and black athletic shorts for PE. Using PE uniforms from middle school is acceptable. You can purchase PE uniforms using a link that will be provided at a later date. You are also welcome to purchase a gray shirt and black shorts anywhere you please. Students will swim during the quarter opposite Driver's Education. Boys need swim shorts. No speedos. Girls need to wear a one piece swimsuit.

When do I sign up for my child to receive a yearbook?

Ordering a yearbook occurs when parents register their students in Infinite Campus. You can select this as an optional fee and then pay for it when you pay for registration or during pay during walk-in registration. The yearbooks are \$75 (anticipated) this year (24/25). The yearbooks can be picked up at registration of the following school year. Questions about this can be directed to Mrs. Jennifer Kelly, yearbook sponsor.

What about the Inkspot school newspaper?

You can select the option to receive the school newspaper through Infinite Campus. It is a \$8 (anticipated) fee and will get your student 2 printed copies each semester throughout the year. Each edition of the *Inkspot* is about 12 pages in length and is a student run newspaper. If the fee has been paid, students can pick up their editions, as they are printed throughout the year, during their lunch periods.

Where can I find information about Athletics?

If you scroll down to the bottom left-hand side of the home screen, you will see Resources. There, you can see online athletic registration instructions, tryout information, the Unit 5 Athletic Code, the Unit 5 Family and Friend Athletic Pass application, the IHSA Physical form and the NCHS sports offerings & start dates.

Is there an orientation for 9th grade students only?

Absolutely! A Freshmen Welcome event will be held on Friday, August 9, 2024 (anticipated) from 8:30-12:00 pm (noon). Student attendance is encouraged. Transportation and lunch will be provided by the district. Students will rotate through several sessions, including meeting their homeroom mentors, taking a tour of the building, walking through the cafeteria set up, and learning about what to expect as a 9th grader at NCHS.

When you pick up your child's schedule at walk in registration, you'll likely see a homeroom listed. What does this mean?

9th grade students have a homeroom attached to their schedule. This is a 15 min block of time either before or after their lunch. Students will report to the room indicated on their schedule, where daily attendance will be taken. Students will participate in the Freshmen Mentoring Program, led by 11th and 12th grade mentors plus staff members, to help with their transition into high school.
