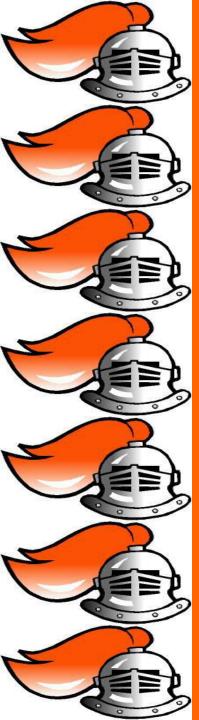

- If you did not fill out survey or have changed your mind-contact your MS counselor ASAP!

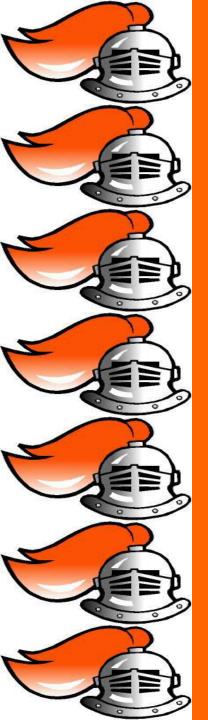

Should I Take Honors or Not??

Definition of Honors:

Honors courses are enriched; they offer the same material in greater depth and with a faster pace...

Honors courses emphasize critical and independent thinking to produce creative application of ideas...

Motivation is the main quality that characterizes an honors student

 Example: Honors English 1 requires significant amount of out of class homework reading & writing. Honors will be writing an analytical 4 page papers while English 1 are working on paragraph formation/1 page papers

Level Changes



- May request within first 4 weeks of semester, ONLY if you have a D or F
- When moving down a level, must show interventions have been utilized.
 Students must fill out form that is provided in counseling office.
- When moving up a level, teacher recommendation and grade are considered.
