
As an Oakdale Panther, I

What is PBIS?

PBIS is a school-wide behavior program that was designed by eight universities and four educational agencies. Its purpose is to reduce problem behavior and encourage positive behavior. Oakdale is beginning its fifth year using this program. Students receive Panther Paws for positive behaviors and for making good choices. PBIS has specific programs in place for students who need extra support. Oakdale is presently using several of these.

In the beginning...

Each school year begins by teaching the desired behaviors in every area of the school. The expectations are gone over again after Winter Break.

Once the students are taught the expectations in each area they are expected to follow them.

Out of the Blue Celebrations

Approximately every three weeks all students have the opportunity to earn a special blue panther paw. This allows them to participate in a planned activity. They do not know when an Out of the Blue Day will occur. The goal is to teach them to want to do what is right all the time, as you never know when you will be rewarded for making good choices. Some past activities have included, kickball, face painting, cookie decorating, etc..

What is an ODR?

An ODR is an **Office Discipline Report**. This is filled out when a student has not followed a specific expectation to the extent that documentation needs to be made. For example a student who does not raise his/her hand in class would not receive an ODR. Yet, a student who chooses to hit another student would receive an ODR.

The data from the ODRs is collected and analyzed to help assist the PBIS team in developing strategies needed to help the students who need to make better choices or to address behavior patterns throughout the school.

Did you know.....each week there is a school-wide Panther Paw drawing? Students who have earned Panther Paws for making good choices throughout that week have a chance to have their name drawn and receive a prize. Each classroom has one school-wide winner.

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
